Good morning Mayor,

Amber relayed to me that you had some additional questions regarding the Flock camera system. Here is the link to their website, which more effectively explains what they do and how they do it.

The initial 60 days are our trial/demo period, so until we complete that I can't provide any information regarding how they will work here in Prescott. However, you may recall that recently the Camp Verde area had a great example of how they used Flock to apprehend some folks who were using credit card skimmers on ATM machines and were linked to a large crime cell.

We are going to request a funding through the Capital request process for the full amount of the contract in the upcoming budget year-so the timing on doing this demo now is really good.

The demo and (hopefully contract) will be for 15 cameras, which we will use to cover all major ingress and egress areas of the City. I do anticipate that we will have great success with this product. Lt. Jason Small has been the one researching this program, and I have CC'd him on this email in case you have further questions. He is our current expert and can get you any additional info you may need.

Hi there!! It has not come to study session and we definitely would prefer that it not, at least not initially. Mostly am concerned about everyone knowing where they are (of course, they will find out eventually). I'm also concerned with the level of conspiracy theorist we may see. That being said, I'm not entirely opposed to it, but would recommend that we present it after the trial period so we have some success stories to share. It is important to note, that Prescott Valley is getting them and the Verde already has them. This will help create a really useful "corridor" of coverage which can only help keep all our communities safer. Additionally, one of the really great things we can tell is traffic volume. The system can tell us how many cars use the roads and how many unique license plates are using them. So for example, in most "traditional" traffic counts you run over rubber tubes in the roadway. If I drove back and forth on Gurley ten times a day, it would inflate the count. But this system can tell us how many unique license plates are using the roadways-and should help when it comes to grants and street planning.

Sooo.....I'll leave it up to you, with the strong suggestion that IF we want it to go to study session, we do so after the trial phase (60 days from date of installation and training).

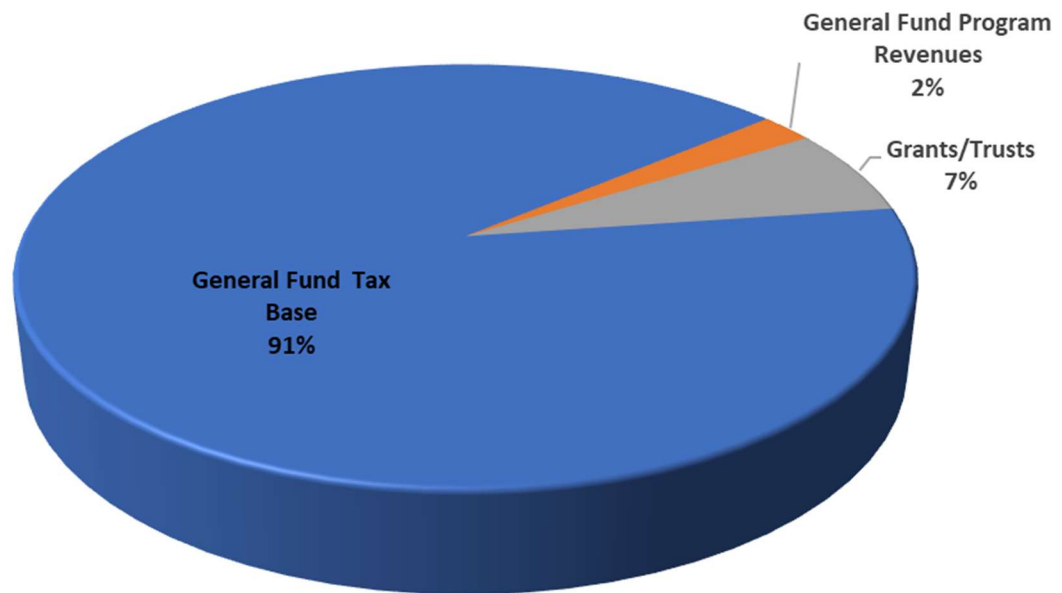

\$1,258,264**FY24-46-04: Police Officers**

Request to add ten (10) additional full-time permanent police officer positions to the Department.

Staffing levels at the Department have remained relatively consistent throughout the past 20 years or more with minimal additional personnel added to account for the geographic expansion of the City of Prescott nor the demands for police services realized through not only an increase in population, but also tourism and economic drivers in the city. This year proposed legislation at the State level discussing requiring police officers to arrive at priority emergency calls for service in a specified amount of time (proposed 5:00 minute response time). Our current staffing puts us at approximately one full minute over that proposed time (5:58 on average).

An increase in the amount of time officers are required to be on calls for service, coupled with the ever increasing complexity of crimes and the types of calls for service has created an increase in workload specifically for our Patrol Bureau and Traffic Safety Section. We have no capacity to deal with additional requests from the public or elected officials when we are routinely at minimum staffing in our Patrol Bureau. The number of public events hosted and supported by the City of Prescott have increased over the years and require additional off duty personnel to be assigned for safety.

In FY23 we had to reassign our entire, six (6) officers, Community Service Section back to Patrol to assist with staffing shortages. This section is our specialized bicycle officers who often are tasked with special projects in the downtown areas at the request of business owners, the Chamber of Commerce, and elected officials. We are unable to fulfil many requests for their expertise at this time because they are assigned to our Patrol Bureau.

Additionally, at current staffing levels we do not have the capacity to absorb employees utilizing their earned benefits such as PTO, and FMLA; for them to attend required training without the extensive use of overtime; to maintain required proficiencies; nor to absorb the loss of personnel due to work related or off-duty injuries.

The addition of ten (10) full time officers will get us closer to meeting the critical goals of continuing to provide excellent customer service in a timely manner to our community, reducing crime and continuing to keep Prescott a safe and healthy community.

The need for additional personnel will be evaluated on an annual basis, with the goal of reaching optimum staffing levels of 8 Officers and 1 sergeant, per squad, in a measured and strategically achievable way, reducing the burden of overtime costs, and maintaining a well-trained and prepared police force.

Request will include all uniforms, gear, ballistic vest, body cam and a separate capital form will be submitted for five (5) new police vehicles.

\$125,826**FY24-46-05 School Resource Officer**

Request to add one (1) new full time permanent Officer position who will be assigned as a School Resource Officer through a partnership with Prescott Unified School District (PUSD).

The Prescott Unified School District recently approached us about a partnership to add a School Resource Officer (SRO) to Mile High Middle School. They proposed a split of 75% paid by a grant from the State of Arizona and 25% paid by the City of Prescott for a 10-month contract for an SRO. This is the same intergovernmental agreement that we have in place with PUSD for the SRO at Prescott High School.

Mile High Middle School the only 7th and 8th grade middle school in the community with the public school system. They have a population that ranges between 575-600 students each year. The middle school sees a high number of criminal offenses including assaults, drugs (and other banned substances), bullying, threats, and harassment. Within this school district, the middle school sees the highest rates of these offenses per capita including the high school. In other words, they have a similar number of offenses as the high school by type, but half as many kids overall. Additionally, the data collected in the 22/23 school year has already surpassed discipline data within the 21/22 school year, and we anticipate these numbers continuing to increase. There are definite safety concerns which could be addressed in part by the addition of an SRO at the school.

We have taken 358 calls to this school in the 21/22 school year, and 160 calls to the school in the 22/23 school year so far (as of 1/1/2023). This is very close to the total number of the calls taken throughout the entire city for the same time period in youth ages 11-15 outside of school.

This school has a school safety team and structure in place to utilize an SRO appropriately, however, without the officer on campus they have had to call dispatch each time to address these issues. Calling dispatch is a reactive response and not a proactive response. With an SRO on campus participating in proactive and preventative education programs, as well as acting as a deterrent and community liaison, we anticipate a significant increase in campus and student safety and decrease in criminal activity.

The SRO will work within this school as a permanent member of the student services team. Working closely with the administration, character coaches, and teachers, they will be able to provide the following services.

- ? Provide appropriate police and enforcement services at school.
- ? Identify students with high truancy rates and intervene with community and parent support resources
- ? Investigate all reported child abuse incidents within the school
- ? Refer or help identify juveniles and/or families that need appropriate social services and connect them with community resources
- ? Network with community agencies, other SRO's and juvenile probation services
- ? Act as a resource investigating school related criminal activities
- ? Participate in campus activities, student organization, and athletics events when feasible and appropriate

- ? Provide a visible deterrence to crime and a positive impression of a law enforcement officer
- ? Collaborate and train school personnel on campus safety and strategies
- ? As necessary follow up with home visits on school related issues
- ? Teach a minimum of 180 hours of classes regarding law related education topics provided with an approved SRO curriculum
- ? Teach on topics regarding safety when and as determined by the SSAP team when they arise
- ? Teach or present at parent nights and other community events to address student safety issues both on and off campus.
- ? Provide support for downtown business during early release Friday where middle school students tend to congregate and cause trouble.

Additionally, this officer will serve as a visible deterrent to off campus intruders and other threats that stem from off campus, as well as providing a first line of defense where the school is under threat by either an outside, or inside source.

Cost to include outfitting the new officer with uniforms, equipment and a separate capital request will be made for a vehicle.

\$144,902

FY24-46-06 Police Sergeant

Request one additional full-time permanent Sergeant position to the Department.

Our current allocated Sergeant positions have increased as a sergeant who had been assigned to the Northern Arizona Regional Training Academy full time had concluded. His three (3) year commitment ended and he has moved back to the Patrol Bureau creating the need. During the time he was assigned to the academy his full salary and employee related expenses were covered by Yavapai College and we backed filled his position with a promotion internally. Our anticipation was that through the retirement of another sergeant we would fill his vacant position, a change in the Deferred Retirement Option Program has allowed this sergeant to extend his stay by two additional years. To move toward our goal of six (6) patrol teams we will need to create one additional sergeant position in the patrol bureau. Currently we are funding this position in FY23 with salary savings from our officer vacancies.

\$75,398**FY24-46-07 New Administrative Specialist**

Request to re-classify a Part Time Police Aide position into a full-time permanent Administrative Specialist position to the Department.

We currently have a part time police aide working for the Department. This position in the past has been a pipeline for an individual that we identify as a potential police officer who does not meet the age qualification. The job duties typically entail tasks such as assisting with quartermaster duties, shuffling vehicles to Fleet for service, assisting with small projects in the Department, assisting in Property and Evidence as well as special events such as Shop with a Cop of the 4th of July Parade. Although sometimes menial these duties would have to be completed by a sworn member of our department without a person assigned to the part time police aide position.

When this position was filled, we identified a new need regarding body worn camera redaction for public records requests. Since implementing Axon Body Worn Cameras in May 2021 to current, we have received eighty six requests for body camera footage or dash camera footage from our officers and we have filled seventy-two of those requests. Total redaction time was over 550 hours of actual work time to redact the videos. We are required to redact certain personal information, victim information and any minor children's information from any video that we release to the public. We are mandated by the victim bill of rights to do so, making this a very time-consuming position.

Our current police aide is completely dedicated to only body cam redaction and is unable to complete any other assigned tasks at this time. When we obtained approval to purchase the body worn cameras, we committed to Council that we would not ask for additional administrative personnel until we could evaluate the actual workload and need to have a dedicated redaction employee. We have gathered data for almost two years that indicates we have a justified need for a full-time position.

This position will redact body worn camera video and in car dash camera video for distribution to the courts, media and public to comply with discovery mandates, subpoenas in compliance with state and federal laws.

We would maintain the PT Police Aide position and fill that if approved.

\$125,116**FY24-46-08 Radio and Telecommunications Technician**

Request to add one (1) new full-time permanent Radio and Telecommunications Technician for public safety.

There is a critical need for a public safety radio technician assigned to Police and Fire full time with auxiliary duties to support the rest of the City of Prescott's radio needs. This position is directly related to the life and safety of our police officers and firefighters in the field as well as the community that they serve.

This position will assume a high level of responsibility in maintaining the operation of city owned, radio and telecommunication backbone system to include research, design, advisement, planning, construction, installation, maintenance, repair and the necessary modifications required to maintain optimum performance of our radio systems. This includes and not limited to point-to-point microwave, two-way radio (digital and analog), antennas/coaxial antenna systems, multiplexers, voters, site power systems, proper grounding techniques, proper RF and AC surge suppression and RF filtering.

There is a need for a highly qualified candidate to assume a high level of responsibility in the planning, design, implementation, and support of City, public safety, and 911 dispatch centers, while working in cooperation with our current IT team. This includes but is not limited to radio dispatch consoles (Zetron), basic network configuration and routing, limited computer desktop support, FCC frequency licensing/management, fire station alerting solutions (2 tone, 5 tone pagers, digital, PLC controllers), voters, receivers, repeaters.

The size and complexity of just the Public Safety Radio system requires at minimum one full time technician. This is the priority of this position. The city utilizes other two-way radio systems that also require a full time position to maintain and support those systems as well. Communications is the lifeline of public safety, and we feel this position is a high priority to public safety and the community that we serve.

This position does not exist within our current job descriptions. Based on research of the field we believe that this position would fall under a pay grade 115, this is a very specialized position and with that would require appropriate compensation to hire the best candidate.

Funding for this position is proposed as a 50/50 split between the Prescott Police Department and the Prescott Fire Department.

\$48,100

FY24-46-13 Flock Safety Contract

- a. Enter into a yearly contract with a company to install and maintain sixteen (16) stationary automatic license plate readers in specified locations throughout the city.
- b. This contract would form a relationship between the vendor and City of Prescott of an annual contract and agreement in which they provide the cameras, and we are billed yearly in the amount of \$48,100.00.
- c. For decades, automatic license plate readers (ALPR's) have assisted law enforcement maintain safe communities, particularly in the forms of traffic control and surveillance. ALPR's have become increasingly divers and have a wide range of application and therefor have become very common in everyday settings related to law enforcement. ALPR systems capture a contextual photo of a vehicle, an image of the license plate, the geographic coordinates of where the image was captured, and the date and time of the recording. This allows us to be altered to vehicles that are wanted in relation to a criminal offense, stolen vehicles, expired and suspended registrations and driver's license. This system will enhance our traffic enforcement and our investigative capabilities, expand our data collection and expedite the time consuming process of comparing vehicle license plates with lists of stolen, wanted or other vehicles of interest. We currently have this technology in limited capacity with our parking enforcement vehicle and with the new camera system installed in the Granite Street Parking Garage.

FY24-46-09 Police Training

With the addition of new officers in the FY23 budget we have found a need to increase the amount of training funds available to our officers. This covers outside training for certifications and other mandated training from the state. The cost of flights, hotels and food have increased significantly over the last several years.

FY24-46-10 Commercial ALPR Data Access

Allow officers and detectives to access commercial automatic license plate reader data from our vendor's commercial ALPR customers. Access to this data significantly adds to the number of available license plate readers that our investigators have access to when needed. Our narcotic detectives and K9's used this system on a trial basis and had great success on several of their cases.

Purchase and outfit five (5) new vehicles to accommodate our new personnel request of ten (10) new full time officer positions.

Operating Budget Impact

Cost to purchase vehicles to include up fitting with all appropriate emergency equipment, radios, mobile data computers, automated external de-fibrators, paint and graphics is estimated to be \$475,000.00 pending a rise in vehicle pricing based on inflation and availability of parts.

Justification (Benefit to Community or Legal Requirement)

The Police Department is submitting a request to add ten (10) new full time police officer positions which will require that addition of at least five (5) new fully marked and outfitted police vehicles. We do not have the capacity in our current patrol fleet to accommodate ten new officers. Officers in the Patrol Bureau are assigned to a vehicle along with one other officer so that we can limit the amount of hours and miles placed on vehicles that are driven 24 hours a day and 7 days a week.

Council Goal or Priority Level

City Council Goal #4 Service Oriented Culture. Police vehicles are essential to our ability to respond to calls for service and often are the rolling office to many of our first responders. These vehicles represent the City of Prescott and should be in a condition that provides confidence and a sense of professionalism for those we serve.

Project Type: Capital Improvement Program
 Department/Division: Police Department - 46/Police Department Admin - 4600

Project/Equipment Description

An additional police facility building to accommodate future needs based on growth of the city and increased housing on the north side of the city. This building would include a police substation, adequate space for the Prescott Regional Communications Center, and space for property and evidence storage in a secure and modern facility that is easily accessible for employees and customers. The project would be completed in two separate phases; property and evidence and communications in phase one followed by a police facility substation in phase two.

Operating Budget Impact

The need for a new police facility, to include police substation, communications, and property and evidence has been identified primarily based upon the age, location, size and capacity to meet the needs in the future. The initial build-out of a new police substation as described is between 3-5 million dollars. This additional facility would require ongoing operating budget support for maintenance and utilities in future budget years.

Justification (Benefit to Community or Legal Requirement)

The city of Prescott population is expanding in many areas, but particularly to the north side of town. Future planned growth in this area includes the Deep Well Ranch project and improvements to the Prescott airport. An additional police facility would address the ongoing needs of the police department, including needed additional space for property and evidence and communications.

Property and evidence is currently housed in several locations throughout the city of Prescott. While some of the items are stored at the police department, other items are stored in locations off site. The police department is running out of space to store items that are required to be stored by statute. The off-site facilities have been retrofitted to meet the immediate needs for property storage. However, these buildings were not constructed with security or safety in mind and staff frequently struggles with not only space for large items such as vehicles, but security issues, rodent infestations and leakage from the roof. A new facility will eventually be necessary to meet the needs of the community.

Additionally, communications is currently located in the downtown area. Their location, an old federal building, was not designed to serve as a communications center. Their current location also puts the communications center within less than 1/8 mile from the back-up communications center (YCSO), which is not optimal should a large scale event occur in the downtown area. By moving the communications center to a remote site, the City would be free to utilize the currently occupied space for other uses more conducive to the needs of the downtown area.

Council Goal or Priority Level

City Council Goal #4-Service Oriented Culture and City Council Goal #3-Quality of Life: A substation on the north side of town would not only house property and evidence and communications, but would also operate as a central location sworn officers as well. This would decrease the response time to calls for service in that area of the city and would be a resource for the community in other ways.

The property and evidence section of the police department is responsible for the safety and security of hundreds of thousands of items each year. These items may be evidence of a crime, lost property or found property. Many of the items are mandated by statute to be held for 99 or more years. Due to the nature of the current property and evidence facilities, it is difficult to maintain the security of all the items and doing so requires constant vigilance on the part of employees. A new facility will create easier access for the public and employees and create efficiencies in the area of customer service due to ease of use and easy access to items.

Police Facility Enhancements and Renovation**Project Account No.:****Ranking:** 07 of 10**General Project Data**

Project Type: Capital Improvement Program
 Department/Division: Police Department - 46/Police Department Admin - 4600

Project/Equipment Description

This project entails improvements and renovations to the police facility located at 222 S. Marina Street to update and enlarge existing offices and spaces to increase capacity and allow expansion for a larger report writing area for police officers and modification to the Animal Control office, employee break room and the women's locker room.

Operating Budget Impact

The police facility is currently undersized to meet the current functions and operations of the police department and is need of improvements and renovation/expansion. The current building, built in 1991, does not have adequate office, storage, or work spaces to meet the growing needs of the Department.

Justification (Benefit to Community or Legal Requirement)

In FY2022 the police department received funding, through capital improvement, to enhance the security of the building. In 2017, a threat and vulnerability assessment of the police facility was conducted. The assessment identified several areas where improvements are needed to better secure the building for the safety of the officers, police staff, and citizens. The recommended physical security enhancements will improve safety for visitors and employees by ensuring access to sensitive areas is appropriately restricted and managed. Those enhancements were approved and are currently in process during this physical year.

The second year capital improvements of this project included interior renovations designed to find adequate and creative solutions to increase capacity of the current building while effectively serving a growing population within the city of Prescott. The interior of the building has seen very few updates or renovations over the past 30 years that is has been utilized by the Police Department. The flooring for the entire building needs to be replaced as much of it is the original flooring. With the growth of our Patrol Bureau we have an immediate need to create more report writing space in our Patrol area, renovate the breakroom into a functional kitchen for our employees to use on a regular basis, expand the women's locker room to accommodate an increase in women officers and non sworn staff and to make needed modifications to the Animal Control office that was once a video studio housed at the Police Department.

There have been plans in the works for the past 10 years to build a new police station, to meet our growing needs, and at this point it appears that there are no plans to build a new station anytime in the near future. The need to renovate this building to create the much needed work space for our employees is essential to maintain the quality and quantity of the work that we expect our employees to perform on a daily basis. The need for a functional and professional building is essential to the mission of our Department. This would include the fees associated with contracting with an architect on all renovations, building plans and construction by an outside contractor as most of the projects we have beyond the scope of work performed by the City of Prescott Facilities Department.

The cost to purchase, install and maintain twenty-one (21) additional dash camera systems. This will be a two-year contract that is an add on to a current contract with our body camera vendor. This contract will extend for two years and totals \$139,162.23

Justification (Benefit to Community or Legal Requirement)

The implementation of video/audio dash camera systems began over twenty years ago when we recognized the need and the value to having the ability to record contacts in the field related to traffic violations and other calls for service. In late 2020 we embarked on a body camera initiative to supplement our dash camera program in an attempt to always remain transparent in our interactions with the community. We installed new dash cameras into our many of our front line vehicles that were from the same vendor as our body cameras and interview room cameras to simplify several things on our end to include digital media storage and access. As we add or replace vehicles in our fleet we will need to add the new dash cameras to the up fitting. We have a current contract with our vendor until 2026 and this would add to that contract which will then be negotiated at the conclusion of our current contract.

Council Goal or Priority Level

City Council Goal #4 Service Oriented Culture. Dash mounted camera systems allow for transparency in our interactions with the community and provide an excellent source of evidence for criminal and civil traffic investigations.

The need for radio communications between team members and dispatch is critical and these headsets provide several options that our normal radio communications microphones and ear pieces do not have. They are sound deadening allowing our operators to have automatic hearing protection in the event of a weapon discharge or other significantly loud noise such as an explosive breach. They also provide for sound enhancing so that we are able to hear people talking to us. This piece of equipment is standard for SWAT operators and the current system that we are using is out of date and they are consistently failing putting our officers in harm's way.

Council Goal or Priority Level

City Council Goal #3-Quality of Life: The existence of a tactical team to respond to emergency calls involving especially hostile individuals is critical to the safety of the people and visitors of the City of Prescott. The SWAT members must have specialized safety equipment for the missions they conduct and to maintain the safety of those around them as well as each other.

Quality of Life Objective – Highly-rated City services. This is an excellent example of our Department being reflective of our community in a creative way. Prescott is a bike friendly city, and our bicycle-passion culture within the police department has grown in a very organic way.

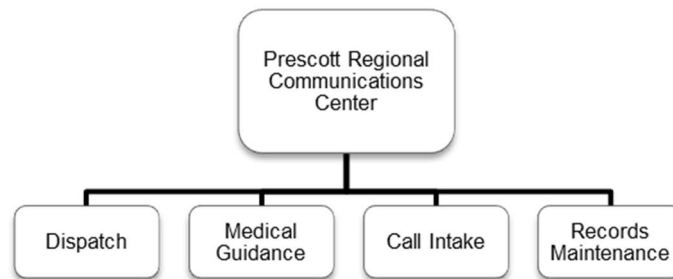

Services

The Prescott Regional Communications Center (PRCC) is responsible for answering 911 lines as well as emergency and non-emergency telephone calls. We are a primary Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) and dispatch for 8 Partnered agencies; 4 fire and 4 police departments. In addition to call taking and dispatching police and fire personnel, staff is responsible to guide callers through CPR and Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD); they are also responsible for entering and updating warrants, performing records searches through ACJIS of people, plates and items, running criminal histories, executing in-house searches of people and addresses, pulling numerous recordings for County Attorneys, citizens, command staff, and fire and police personnel.

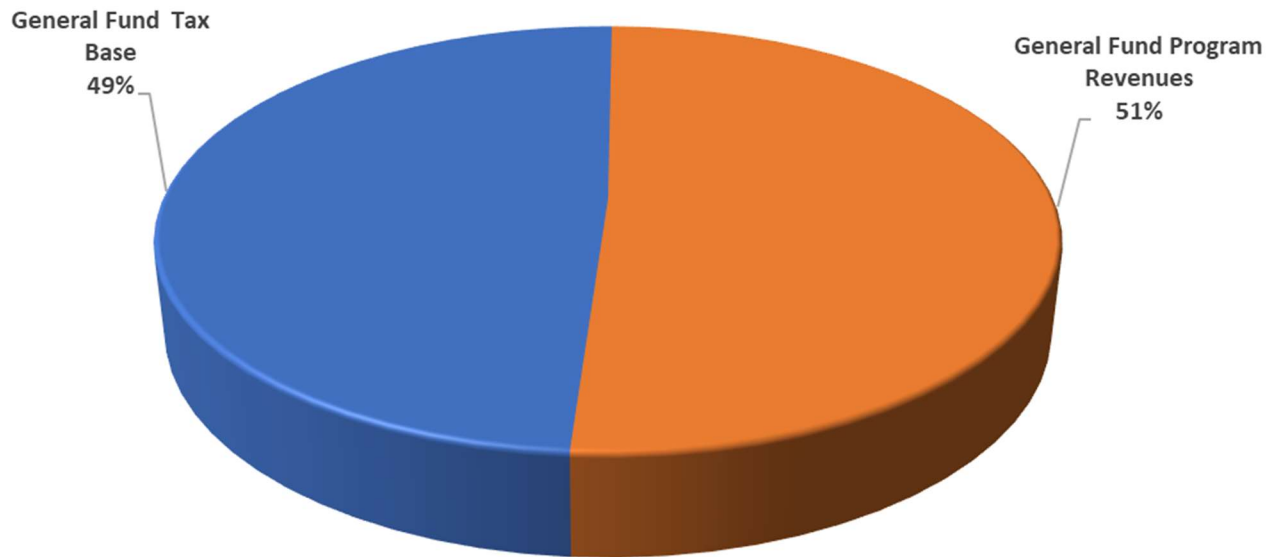
